







WOMEN'S POLO IN MANIPUR

Inspired by the Women Polo Players of Manipur

Manipur leads the nation in producing sporting talent. Polo in Manipur is an egalitarian sport founded in its villages. About 3/4 of the India's women polo players come from Manipur, all from modest backgrounds. The state fields 4 women's teams.

Empowerment of women in Manipur is without parallel in India.







POLO YATRA

Huntré! Equine's international initiative supports, develops and promotes women's polo in India. It is centered on the Manipur Statehood Day Women's Polo Tournament, the first and only women's polo tournament in India, started with the sponsorship of Manipur Tourism of the Government of Manipur, and with additional support of the Ministry of Tourism in New Delhi. Team Argentina won the BSE Cup in 2019





*l*oman Power Woman Polo

Created in collaboration with the USPA, the annual tournament brings women's teams from the US, Argentina, Great Britain, Australia, Egypt, and Kenya... and reaches out across India to Jaipur, Mumbai, and Hyderabad.

Manipur Cup in Argentina

The Asociación Argentina de Polo (AAP) held Torneo Manipur, a ladies' polo tournament in Argentina in 2018 and 2019.



El Cuero Manipur

Named after the birthplace of modern polo. Born on Nov 9, the first day of Torneo Manipur in Buenos Aires to papa Gete Atrevido (Galgo-Atrevido) and mama Catalina (Cinco Grande- Secretariat)

NO PONY NO POLO One of 5 equine breeds in India, the population has dwindled to just 500.

Huntré Equine has been spearheading the efforts to save the endangered Manipuri Pony, the original polo pony:

- a social media campaign to create awareness and concern
- corralled the influence of the USPA and the global polo community
- campaigned to declare it as an Endangered Breed
- worked to get 200 acres allotted by the state for a pony preserve
- initiated and enabled the passage of a state pony preservation policy
- held an international pony preservation conference at Manipur University
- starting Kumbi Polo Village, a community-based rural pony preservation project in 2020



KUMBI POLO VILLAGE

Huntre! Equiné embarks on a rural polo revival and community pony preservation at Kumbi, a village on the shores on Loktak Lake.

With the support of the US and Argentina polo teams, the Kumbi Polo Village project begins with a US Polo Coaching Camp in January 2020 for rural youth from the equestrian communities of Kumbi Village, Bishenpur, and Moirang.

Polo Yatra joins hands with Frédérique Constant Genève to help build its new national platform for women's polo in India by bringing it to Manipur, the home of women's polo in India.

After its debut in Jodhpur, Pink Beret Polo will launch in Imphal at the 5th Manipur Statehood Day Women's Polo Tournament in January 2020.
